To understand your Personality Type, take the following twenty question quiz. There are no right or wrong answers; in fact, the quiz is really a selection of preferences and completing it is easy. There are some guidelines, however. When taking the quiz, pretend that you live in a world without financial issues or compromised circumstances. Follow your inner fantasies, not your real life needs. For instance, if asked about your ideal vacation home, choose a place that captures your fancy; don't consider what your family might prefer or what you can afford. Some of the questions will place you within traditional jobs and steady relationships; if these circumstances don't apply to you, do your best to picture yourself within those circumstances and respond accordingly.

In most of the following questions, you will be asked to choose one answer out of four. Some questions have eight answers; of these you may choose either one or two, depending on the instructions. Though the quiz is more accurate when each question is completed according to instructions, you might come across a question in which none of the answer seems at all right for you. If this should happen, simply skip it. Conversely, if you find a question in which you're hopelessly torn between two answers, you may choose them both.

The Quiz

- 1.** You're about to hit a personal milestone (major birthday, anniversary, etc.) and have learned that a close friend is throwing a surprise party for you. In your secret heart, you hope the upcoming event is:
